





Here are some surprising and shocking facts...

- ◆ 22% of Evangelicals have made a conscious decision to hide their faith from their friends for fear they might offend them.
- ◆ 34% of U. S. teens hold different religious beliefs than their parents, but they have decided not to tell their parents.
- ◆ For the first time ever, less than half of Americans (47%) say they belong to or are members of a local church.
- ◆ One-half of American adults (49%) don't know whether it was Paul, Peter, John, or Jesus who taught the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospels.
- ◆ 30% of Evangelicals agree that Jesus was a great teacher, but he wasn't God! Bible reading declined by 7% during the first six months of COVID-19.
- ◆ 68% of all evangelical churches in the United States have a congregation with less than 100 people including children and half of those churches have less than 50!

Session met on September 22, 2021, at 6:00 PM in the Hudson Room with Rev. Dave Roberts presiding as Moderator.

Clerk's Report was given as follows; All-Anon AA Banquet has been cancelled. Regular meeting and normal refreshment will be served. The list personnel of the Nominating Committee with attached By-laws was distributed to the Session.

Chairman Dave Misko reported that our investments are doing quite well and we are maintaining a good balance in checking. Awaiting the costs of the repairs to the church building and Fellowship Hall roof. Approval was given for a petty cash to be secured in the Treasurer's Office. Some members of Session have been approached after Sunday services for financial help for small items such as gasoline, etc.

The Music and Worship Committee reported that the pulpit for all Sundays for the remainder of the year are filled.

Outreach and Evangelism Committee did not meet.

The Trustees report was that they are still waiting on General Restoration to begin work on the church building. The contractor for the roof on Fellowship Hall has been approved and contacted. A brief discussion was held by Session as to the status of the manse.

Charles Bizzari reported that he and Jack Kibble had met with the Deacons and Stewardesses and the group agreed that the Stewardesses would be combined with the Deacons. Another meeting to be held with a recommendation of number of Deacons to be elected for a 3 year term. Adding there must be a revision to the bylaws.

Session approved that our kitchen is to remain closed until further notice due to the uptick in the COVID count in the county. Masks are not yet mandated.

John Visser informed session that he and his wife will begin a Youth Sunday School on October 3. Session approved the proposal. Also a motion prevailed to "pencil in" Hoard and Jones for December 5<sup>th</sup> pending COVID regulations.
